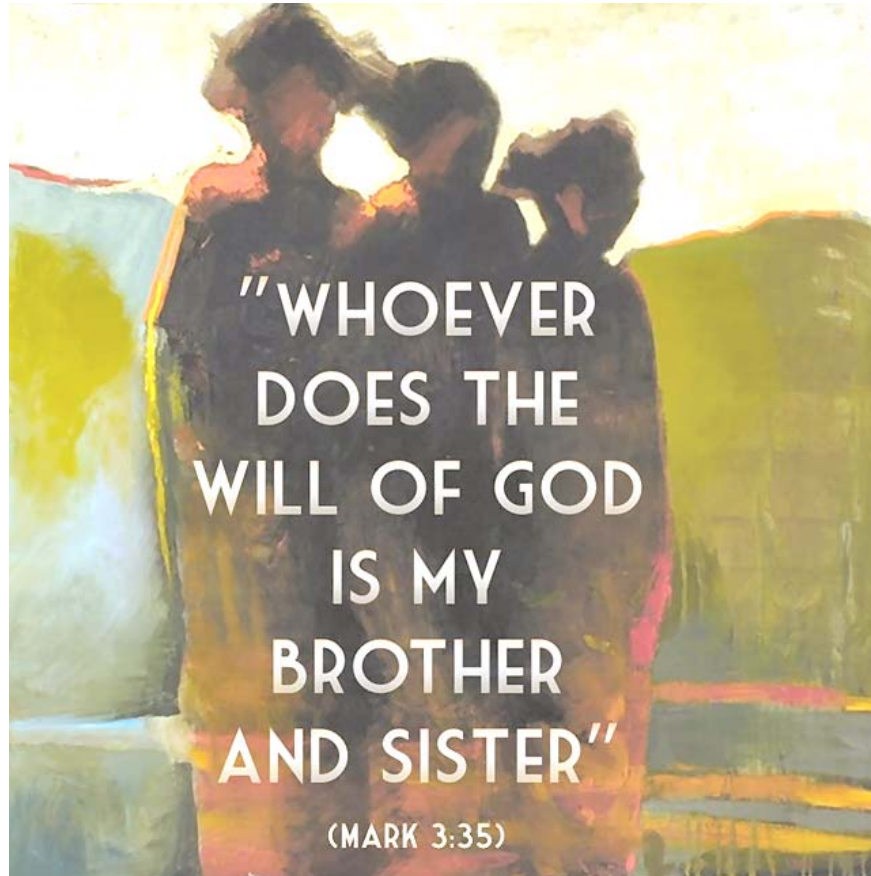

JESUS REVEALS OUR DISTORTED VIEWS OF GOD

When his family heard about this, they went to take charge of him, for they said, “He is out of his mind.” And the teachers of the law who came down from Jerusalem said, “He is possessed by Beelzebul!” (Mark 3:21-22)

THE UNFORGIVEABLE SIN IS TO REJECT JESUS AS HE REALLY IS

“Truly I tell you, people can be forgiven all their sins and every slander they utter, but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never be forgiven; they are guilty of an eternal sin.” (Mark 3:28-29)

JESUS IS STRONG ENOUGH TO FREE US FROM OUR DISTORTED VIEW OF GOD

“No one can enter a strong man’s house without first tying him up. Then he can plunder the strong man’s house...People can be forgiven all their sins...Whoever does God’s will is my brother and sister and mother.” (Mark 3:27, 28, 35)

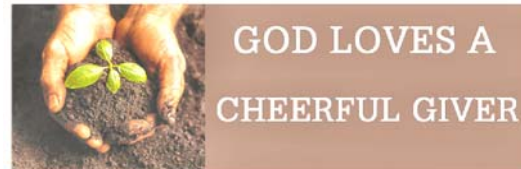
