“The King Provides”

Mark 6:30-44

My purpose is to challenge us to trust that King Jesus provides all we ever need!

I. The King Provides REST

Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat, he said to them, “Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest. (verse 31)

II. The King Provides COMPASSION

When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. (verse 34a)

III. The King Provides FOOD

Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to his disciples to distribute to the people. (verse 41a)

Therefore, the King Provides All We Need if we give what we have to Him first.

Will you give your loaves and fishes to Jesus so he can bless them and break them and multitudes feed?

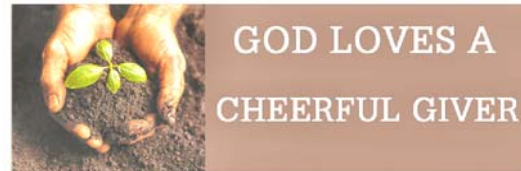
