


Dear Beloit First Christian Church,



April 2016 was a good month for Hope Ranch for Women. Lives are slowly being changed for the better, and given to Christ.

Our Mentoring programs continue to make good progress. We have over twenty fully trained and functioning Mentors actively meeting with Mentees. We encourage them to communicate at least weekly, but in practice, most of the Mentors and Mentees communicate far more frequently. In April we had over 220 hours of structured mentoring, i.e., that is in addition to frequent communication via telephone conversations and texting.

Our Equine program is also changing lives and demonstrating the freedom of trusting Christ. In April we had: 1) three group sessions including 12 women, 2) twenty-five individual equine assisted healing sessions of horses walking with women, and 3) eight private Freedom healing sessions – all led by the Holy Spirit.

Our residence is furnished and ready for use. We have elected to not open it to residents until we have one year operating capital in the bank. In order to adequately and compassionately care for survivors, HR4W must be financially stable. Understandably survivors find it difficult to trust people or systematic care. The last thing we would want is to do more harm than good by opening the home too soon, then be forced to ask them to leave because of a temporary funding shortfall. Thus, the home is physically ready - but not available for residents until additional funding is raised.



Since the home is fully functional, we will use it for God's benefit. Toward that end, we are making it available to Christ centered teams for short term training and networking events. Until we are ready to provide a secure shelter, we will use the home for retreats for survivors as well as for survivor leaders and others who are supporting the abused and exploited.

Thank you for supporting Hope Ranch for Women with your time, money and prayers. We count on all three. You are an integral part of this Christ-centered ministry as we serve the marginalized and often voiceless victims while empowering them to overcome their past and move powerfully into God's beautiful destiny.
